Minimum Play Rules**

**10-18-07 Addendum**

Minimum play rules are as follows:

- All players must play in the game, a minimum of 2 full quarters, if they are physically fit and fully equipped.
  - Minimum play rules will be monitored by head coaches and field officials.
  - Each team must present the opposing team with a completed line up card at weigh-ins.
  - Line up cards shall specify the numbers of players that will be playing in the game and shall further specify the numbers of the players for each half and if they are to be on the field during offense, defense or a substitute.
  - Teams that have more than 22 players in attendance at a game are required to list the substitutes on the line up card for both offense, defense, and for each half. No player shall be a substitute for both the first and second half.
  - Players that have been specified as an offensive player in the first half may not be specified an offensive player the second half. Likewise any player specified as a defensive player in the first half shall not be specified as a defensive player in the second half. Except in the following situations:
    - Teams may specify a single player to play quarterback and center in both the first half and second half. Teams electing this option will not be allowed to use the quarterback/center on the defense in either half.
    - Teams with less than 22 players must specify the players that will enter the game on both offense and defense during the same half. Their numbers must appear in both the offensive and defensive sections of the line up card for that half. The "No Defensive Play" still applies for the Full time quarterback or center.
  - Only those players listed on the line up card may enter the game during their designated offensive or defensive set. Any player not specified on the line up card that enters the game has committed a minimum play rule violation.
  - Substitutes may only enter the game in the event of injury. An injured player that has recovered should be reinstated into the game as soon as physically possible. The substitute that entered the game shall be required to be listed as a starter in the second half if such an injury has occurred in the first half.
  - PAT kick attempts are exempt from the minimum play rule. Any player may attempt to kick a PAT after a touchdown at any time during the game.
  - After the fourth game of the season, during which time the coaches are removed from the field and play callers are required, the rostered starting players becomes 12 on offense and 12 on defense. One spot is utilized for the play carrier to shuttle the respective plays in. In the event that a team does not have 24 players, any player can be selected to carry the plays in with the exception of a full time quarterback or center. The play carriers names and numbers must be listed on the line up card. They will be the only players allowed to shuttle plays in with the exception of when the play carrier becomes injured. The same rule as above, referencing replacing an injured player will apply.
  - During the first four games, when the starting roster is 11 for offense and 11 for defense, and a team has less than 22 players, a player may be selected to play both offense and defense in the same half. The players name and number must be listed on the line up card in both the offensive and defensive columns. The same rule would apply when coaches are removed from the field and the starting rosters require 12 players per unit. Again, a full time quarterback or center can not be used on defense.
- All line up cards must have substitutes listed for both offense and defense. Substitutes will consist of the players in excess of the starting line up, 11 or 12 players, if a team has a roster larger than 22 or 24 players. In the event that a team does not consist of the minimum starting line up, players from the offensive unit will be listed as a defensive substitute and players from the defensive unit will be listed as an offensive substitute. They will only be permitted in the game in the event of an injury and the full time quarterback or center can not be used as a defensive substitute.
